

Council Meeting of June 9, 2020

President John Steele called the meeting to order and Pastor Nielsen led us in prayer.

Present in person: President John Steele, Vice-president Chris Severt, Pastor Nielsen, Treasurer Stan Koenig, Elder Tim Dennis, Board of Ed Maryann Thompson, Trustee Tom Lipke and via telephone Secretary Kelly Cornelius.

Secretary's Report: Secretary Kelly Cornelius read the Council Meeting minutes of May, 12, 2020. A motion was made by Stan Koenig, seconded by Chris Severt to accept the minutes as read and motion carried.

Treasurers Report: Treasurer Stan Koenig reported the May, 2020, Financial Summary as follows: General Fund balance as of May 1, 2020, in the amount of \$2,919.32 (in the hole). General Fund income of \$10,821.53 and expenses of \$9,492.20 for a balance as of May 30, 2020, of \$1,589.99 (in the hole). Checking account at Sterling Bank is at \$40,141.28 and savings account at \$14,193.52. LCEF Fund: \$20,871.36 Missions: \$715.00 Building Fund: \$340.00 The amount due and owing to the playground account is now \$557.95. Further, \$1,335,00 has been given toward the video upgrade cost. A motion was made by Chris Severt, seconded by Tim Dennis to accept the Treasurer's Report and motion carried.

Elders Report: It was noted that the internet signal was good two Sundays ago, not so good last Sunday. We will have disinfectant, sanitizers, and masks on hand. We are working on getting sprayers. Pastor has been having Sunday Bible classes on Zoom. We have lawn mowing volunteers for the summer. We have been receiving donations to improve the internet signal. The Confirmands are ready for questioning. How this will be done has not been decided. Pastor will talk with parents about how Confirmation will take place. How and when do we reopen the church for Sunday worship? Pastor made his recommendations, and after discussion, the was following was agreed upon: A) The church will reopen for services on Sunday, June 14, 2020. There will be two services, 8:30 a.m., and 10:30 a.m. Pastor will send out a letter which will explain the "new normal". Members will be asked to sign up for the service they plan to attend. Members may be asked when they plan to start attending services again. Sick people should stay home. B) The church will be deep cleaned, including the carpet, before June 14th. A date is yet to be set. The church will be sprayed with disinfectant between first and second services, but probably not after the second service. Hymnals, pencils, communion cards and pew cushions will be removed. Windows and doors will be open and fans operating for optimal ventilation. C) Attendance will be taken. Only every other pew will be used and pews used in the first service will not be used during the second service. Social distancing must be maintained by different family groups using the same pew, preferably one family group per pew. Bulletins will be on the pews or at a table and should be taken home. Offering plates will be in the back of the church, and in the front during communion. Mask wearing is recommended but not mandatory. Masks will be available. Children will remain in the pews for the Children's Message. D) For communion, two tables will be set up in front of the rail. One table will have the wafers, the other table the wine in disposable individual cups. Members will come up one pew at a time and take the wafer and wine, and after communing will return to their pew. It is realized that things may need to be "fined tuned" over time. A motion was made by Tom Lipke, seconded by Stan Koenig to accept the

Elders' Report and motion carried.

Trustee's Report: Tom Lipke reported to Council that Salem's shelter has no electricity and, therefore, is not functional in that respect should needs require use of the shelter. Tom received a quote of \$3,000 from a local electrical company to get the job done which would include burrowing under pavement and installing the wiring and such. After discussion, it was decided to table this project for now. Due to recent heavy rain, there was water in the basement of the parsonage. Among other things, ground work was done, sloping the soil away from the foundation on the west side. Tom reported he had four people to assist in cleaning the carpets at the church. It was a lot of work with few people taking on the project but it is done. Sanitizing stations, sprays and sprayers as well as gloves have been ordered. A motion was made by Chris Severt, seconded by Tim Dennis to accept the Trustee's Report and motion carried.

Board of Ed: Maryann Thompson reported YFM extended the fishing contest to July 5, 2020. YFM is hosting a root beer float treat after services on July 12th, serving people as they drive up to receive them, eliminating serving them inside as in the past. A donation bucket will be available. Pastor has cards from Thrivant which will be sent out to shut-ins and those in nursing facilities. Planning a church picnic for August 7, 2020. Chicken will be served along with a number of side dishes. A motion was made by Tim Dennis, seconded by Chris Severt to accept the Board of Ed report and motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor advised he will have a stay at home vacation this year. Pastor is taking online classes. Camp Luther continues to struggle and could use some financial support. Pastor continues to offer Bible study via Zoom. Advised of the eighth graders and their Confirmation questioning and Confirmation day that are yet to be scheduled. Pastor reported of a new member class. The Synod is currently working on the Constitution as it relates to having virtual Congregational Meetings. The Barron Area Clergy Association met a couple of weeks ago. Pastor reported the internet has been upgraded. A motion was made by Tom Lipke, seconded by Chris Severt to accept the Pastor's Report and motion carried .

Discussion was had on how future Congregational Voter's Meetings would look like. The new video camera comes at a cost of \$2,100. It was decided not to purchase it until monies came in to cover the cost. Salem's playground, currently closed, will once again be opened for use. Having a garage sale during the city wide garage sale was discussed. Maryann will see what the status of that is with the city and how that would look like. The survey that was provided to members resulted in the following 19 responses received so far: close to half of the members said they will personally return to church services and close to half of the members said they will not return to church at this time.

A motion was made by Chris Severt, seconded by Tim Dennis to adjourn and motion carried.


