


Pastor's Page

Dear Saints of God,

Families are a blessing from God and as we are each a part of family, a question that keeps cropping up in my mind is how do we best care for the next generation, our children. The answer is to pass on to them the faith. Solomon does this in the book of Proverbs. His focus on raising his son in the faith begins right from the very beginning when he writes: "Hear, my son, your father's instruction, and forsake not your mother's teaching" (Prov. 1:8). Andrew Steinmann writes:



It is noteworthy that both parents are mentioned here and elsewhere in Proverbs as involved in the training of a child. Some understand the address as coming from a sage to a pupil, who is not a biological child. While a sage could address his student as "son", the continued reference throughout Proverbs to both mother and father as instructors and trainers of children—and their pride in children who do well, and their shame when their children go astray—indicates that this is instruction from actual parents. Also note that Solomon mentions learning the same lessons from his own parents. The responsibilities of parents to train children are, therefore taken seriously in Proverbs, especially in the opening chapters.¹

Solomon is writing this portion of the Proverbs to his son in the first person, "my son" repeatedly. Solomon is doing what God teaches in Scripture that is, that parents are to raise their children in the faith.

As one reads through these first nine chapters of Proverbs, one will notice that it is instruction on living by God's Word. Steinmann writes: "This organization was part of the author's scheme to instruct his son in the wisdom of living by the guidance of God's Word, so that the son might receive the manifold blessings of wisdom and hence live—both in this life and for eternity." Solomon understood, at least at this point in his life, that God's Word was critical for his son to live in this life.

Solomon continues to share the importance of raising children in the faith. One of the most popular verses that backs up this clear thought that parents are to be involved in raising their children in the faith is Proverbs 22:6 which says, "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." The very first words that implies training actually means something along the lines as "starting a child along a certain course in life." Solomon brings baptismal imagery into the discussion. Discipleship making begins at baptism and it continues with teaching. After baptism, parents are to teach their children the way, the good way which is Christ alone.

This Proverb of Solomon also shows that this task is a lifelong process. This learning of the faith does

not stop when one moves out of the house, but it continues throughout life, but what is important here is that "this proverb teaches that parents are to consecrate, discipline, and educate their children according to the Word of God in the way of wisdom, which is the way of faith and everlasting life." This proverb is critical in pointing out that parents have a God-given command to teach their children.

It also shows the impact parents can have on their children when it asserts that "even when he is old he will not depart from it" (Prov. 22:6). In a paper to the 2014 Missouri District Professional Church Workers Conference, Mart Thompson stated: "The Lord offers a comforting word to faithful parents who are tempted to doubt whether their labors in raising their children in the way of the Lord will be successful.... The Lord promises that when parents are faithful to their task that the lessons learned in the home will bear fruit later if not sooner." This is a great and comforting promise and does show the impact parents have on their children.

Yet, it is also true that there are children who grow up in homes where the faith is taught, leave the church, and even walk away from Christ. Steinmann holds this reality up clearly: "Does this proverb promise that every child who wanders away from faith in Christ will eventually return at some point later in life before he dies, and so be saved eternally? Many parents pray that it would be so, and God hears such prayers." Any faithful parent would pray that their child would return. When a child leaves the faith, it is difficult for the Christian parent, but part of the parent's task is to continue to pray for their child that the Holy Spirit would eventually lead them back.

My prayer for all of you is that you continue to teach your children and pray for them, even when they are out of the house.

Council Meeting 01/11/2022

Present: Pastor Michael Nielsen, Vice President Josh Millerman, Head Elder Paul Millerman, Secretary Sarah Duncan, Treasurer MaryAnn Thompson, President John Steele, Board of Education Chris Severt.

Pastor led us in devotional and prayer.

Secretary Report: Secretary Sarah Duncan read the meeting minutes from the December 5, 2021 Annual Meeting. There are 2 amendments to be made to the minutes. Add Pastor's new salary of \$58806.00, health insurance \$4600, retirement \$5116.12, disability survivor \$1323.13, no HSA, plus an additional week of vacation time. Remove the statement in New Business about funding coming from state assistance. It should say student's parents. A motion was made by Chris Severt to accept amended minutes and seconded by Josh Millerman and motion carried.

Treasurer Report: MaryAnn Thompson advised the December 2021 financial summary as follows: General Fund Balance (4101) as of 12/01/2021 \$61770.71. December income \$14613.23. December expenses \$10488.02. Net income for December \$4125.21. Missions \$553. Building fund \$375. Gifts and Memorials \$1975.71. Sunday school offerings \$125.57. Daycare giving \$446. Air Conditioning \$50. Daycare income \$11277.00. General Fund Balance 12/31/2021 \$65895.92. Checking account at Sterling Bank \$46951.00. Savings account at Sterling Bank \$17317.92. LCEF \$26438.25. Daycare Checking \$9828.01. Discussed summary of Report Church. MaryAnn is going to send the following to council each month: Summary of Report Church, Profit/Loss budget actual, Daycare. The daycare received 2 grants worth \$800 and \$2525 in the months of November and December. This money should go toward supplies and employee training & retention. Johnson/Agen is going to set up a sub-account for the grant money. Scott Q will be able to create similar reports as Johnson/Agen so reports should be more understandable. A motion was made by Chris Severt to accept the report and seconded by Paul Millerman and motion carried.

Elder's Report: Paul Millerman advised that Tom Lipke is going to start disinfecting tables in bathrooms. High school class is going well. Lock-in was a great success. Pastor and Jolene are talking about a young parent class. Pastor is seeing shut-ins. Pastor is doing a pre-marital class. Seder meal is being planned. Elders will be contacting members that have been absent for an extended period of time. Reminders are going to be sent to ushers. Updating membership records. Elders discussed chapter 4 of their book. A motion was made by Chris Severt to accept the report and seconded by Tom Lipke and motion carried.

Trustee's Report: Tom Lipke advised that there have been furnace issues. Solutions came to work on it and made some adjustments. They also looked at the parsonage and made some adjustments there. They suggested a new furnace in the near future. Tom will get quotes and put it on a yearly maintenance schedule. Parsonage hot water heater broke down and Josh Millerman installed a new one. Church carpets are getting cleaned in the Spring. Looking for volunteers to help with the shampooing. A motion was made by Chris Severt to accept the report and seconded by Josh Millerman and motion carried.

Board of Ed: Chris Severt advised that a job offer has been made to Jasmine as a lead teacher in the daycare/preschool. Laura was interviewed and hired as a lead teacher. More staffing conversation. Mandi has applied for grants and details of that are in the treasurer's report. There is a struggling family in the daycare

that are behind on payments due to COVID so the church is going to do a free-will donation on the next 2 Sundays for them. BOE is meeting again on January 16. Mandi's review is on January 27th. We need to address daycare/preschool curriculum and teacher contracts. Sunday school is going well. Melissa did a great job on the Christmas program. Sunday School kids will be singing the last Sunday of January. Planning snow tubing. Planning board training. A motion was made by Paul Millerman to accept the report and seconded by Josh Millerman and motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor advised that he will be presenting his Doctor of Ministry work via newsletter articles and in leadership meetings. He attended Winkel via Zoom. There is still a steering committee for a Lutheran school in our area. Men's bible study: Isaiah. Thursday bible study: Christianity. Sunday morning bible study: Ask, Seek, Knock which focuses on prayer. BACA is meeting February 1st. A motion was made by Chris Severt to accept the report and seconded by Paul Millerman and motion carried.

Old Business:

Steering committee for Lutheran School: planning to open Fall of 2024. Pastor Paul wants to make sure there is enough money to support a quality staff. He is hoping that APEX estate planning could help congregation members support. Looking for ideas for fund raising. The school will be named: Christ Community Church.

New Business:

Ann Matheny will be at Salem February 13 to discuss choice dollars.

The daycare/preschool will be going to Barron chamber meetings. They are held the 3rd Thursday of each month at city hall.


A motion was made by Chris Severt and seconded by Paul Millerman to adjourn the meeting and motion carried.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

CHRIST is not the last name of Jesus. It is His title, who He is for us. Peter confessed concerning Jesus "You are the Christ!" (Matt 16:16). The word Christ comes from Greek meaning anointed. Prophets, priests and kings were anointed. Jesus is the anointed one for us. The Old Testament promised the coming of THE CHRIST. These are some of our present goals:

- *Open in the Fall of 2024
- *Be accredited by the Consortium of Classical Lutheran Education and the National Lutheran School Accreditation
- *Provide a Kindergarten through 12th grade education
- *Select and hire an administrator who will begin work, in some capacity, in the summer of 2023.
- *Be centrally located in the circuit (The Almena area along Hwy 8)
- *Be open to all Christians from various denominations
- *Contract with Apex Legacy Consultants to work with dedicated Christ Community Patrons and guide congregations in establishing Education Funds & Endowments to support CCLS

- *Apply for a grant from the North Wisconsin District to assist with the cost of the Apex Legacy partnership
- *To have at least one CCLS School Board member attend the Consortium of Classical Lutheran Education Conference in Fort Wayne, IN July 5-8th to network with teachers and administrators
- *To visit circuit congregations to encourage and help them prepare to fiscally support their member families and children who will be attending CCLS
- *To raise \$50,000 in 2022
- *To host an in person CCLS update in Almena this Spring
- *Establish a website
