

- 3) Small group communion is still suspended. I am currently praying about this and reevaluating each week.

- 5) Confirmation and Confirmation Questioning is postponed. We will let everyone know when this is rescheduled.

Joint Elders and Council Meeting of April 1, 2020

President John Steele called the meeting to order and Pastor Nielsen led us in prayer.

Elders and Council were present via Zoom or telelphone.

Stan Koenig gave an update on the call in line which seems to be working well. Because of the high volume of users on the line recently, as well as in the foreseeable future, it was suggested to increase the number of minutes to 10,000 useable minutes. This would come at a cost of \$70.00 per month plus tax. It should be noted that we can change our minute amounts needed at any time. Chris Severt made the motion to increase our minute usage to 10,000, totaling \$70.00 per month plus tax, seconded by Tim Dennis and motion carried.

Board of Ed: Met Wednesday. Advised four applicants were interviewed and the Board of Ed agreed on the top candidate. Requested a Congregational Meeting be scheduled for reasons of finances, hiring process, etc. The Council and Elders will need to seek out Salem's Constitution to see how Salem needs to address these issues. Chris Severt shared financial information he received from a local bank as far as interest rates and such. Maryann Thompson reported Any Beckendorf is preparing a power point presentation at it relates to the daycare. Decided on a presentation via Facebook on April 15, 2020, with a Congregational Voter's Meeting on April 26, 2020, in the church parking lot. Be advised, pursuant to the health crisis, the April 26th, meeting is tentative and District will notify us whether or not we can proceed with the meeting or if we need to reschedule. In any event, need a vote on a business loan as it relates to our day care/preschool financial needs and the congregation's approval to spend monies. The Board of Ed will be contacting the director position candidates with a status of Salem's intentions. Further, a notice/agenda will be sent out to the congregation two weeks prior to the April 26th, Congregational Voter's Meeting. Again, the April 26th, meeting is obviously subject to change due to the current Coronavirus health crisis.

Discussed ways of cutting back costs for Salem since the building is not currently being used. Those cuts have been made such as turning off the heat in the sanctuary as well as the Sunday School area downstairs. Tom Lipke will be checking with Independent Garbage Service to see what rates they would give us to see if their services would be cheaper than the services Republic Service is providing Salem for garbage pickup. Tom will further see what rates would be if we had garbage picked up less often than we are currently doing.

Stan Koenig advised he purchased a computer in the amount of \$619.00 for the financial bookkeeper. May want to purchase Quick Books at some point.

Josh Millerman advised he has not yet received anything back from Arrow Building Center nor from Bill Balts and will be getting a bid from another contractor. In order to get the bids back from the contractors need to first hear what material costs are from Arrow Building along with Arrow Building plans. The health crisis no doubt is having an effect on getting this information in a more timely manner but hopefully this information can be obtained in time for the April 26th, meeting.

A motion was made by Chris Severt, seconded by Tim Dennis to adjourn and motion carried.

Minutes by Kelly Cornelius

Council Meeting of April 14, 2020

President John Steele called the meeting to order and Pastor Nielsen led us in prayer.

Present via Zoom and phone: President John Steele, Pastor Nielsen, Vicepresident Chris Severt, Treasurer Stan Koenig, Board of Ed Maryann Thompson, Elder Tim Dennis, Trustee Tom Lipke, and Secretary Kelly Cornelius.

Secretary's Report: Secretary Kelly Cornelius read the Council Meeting minutes of March 10, 2020. A motion was made by Chris Severt, seconded by Tim Dennis to accept the minutes as read and motion carried.

Treasurers Report: Treasurer Stan Koenig reported the March Financial Summary as follows: General Fund balance as of March 1, 2030, in the amount of \$5,359.45. General Fund income of \$11,394.62 and expenses at \$10,409.60 for a balance as of March 31, 2020, of \$4,374.43. Missions: \$765.00. Building Fund: 486.00. Sunday School: \$62.94. Thrivant Choice Dollars of \$1,348.00. The playground balance to be paid is now at \$1,047.95. Ring Central costs for March: \$399.90. Checking account at Sterling Bank of \$38,466.99 and savings account at \$14,193.52. LCEF Building Fund: \$20,225.36. The General Fund (4101) for January to March is \$31,589.28. A motion was made by Tim Dennis, seconded by Chris Severt to accept the Treasurers Report and motion carried.

Elders' Report: The "Listen to Church" service line seems to be working well. A new computer has been purchased for finances. Average attendance for March (three services) was 86, with midweek services averaging 47. March communion was 69 and 60. Pastor made four nursing home visits before the no visitor policy. Pastor called shut-ins and sent Portals of Prayer. Al Klug's burial was March 29, 2020, and there was a Baptism the same day. When possible, there will be public acknowledgement of these services. There were some family communions in March. The Voter's Meeting will be on April 26, 2020, if the "Safer at Home" mandate is over. If it is still in effect, the meeting will be postponed. E-giving is available. A number of checks are arriving by mail. Salem received a \$1,150 check from Thrivant. Pastor is going through the church roster, phoning members to touch base and check on everybody. This takes time. It was suggested that each elder take a portion of the church roster and call once or twice a month, in addition to Pastor's calls. This will be tried. Pastor will try and improve the transmission of services over Facebook. The service location may be changed to the Fellowship Hall for better transmission. A motion was made by Stan Koenig, seconded by Tim Lipke to accept the Elders Report and motion carried.

Trustee's Report: Items that were cleaned out of the rooms to the east were hauled out to the shelter. Tom checked with Independent Garbage Service and found their services to be the same in costs as that of Republic Services. As such, Salem will remain with Republic Services for garbage pickup. Tom said a few people were needed to assist with cleaning up Salem's lawn. A motion was made by Chris Severt, seconded Stan Koenig to accept the Trustee's Report and motion carried.

Board of Ed: Maryann Thompson reported the Sunday School teachers have dropped off packets to the Sunday School children. There will be no Easter Egg hunt this year at Salem. The Thrivant Choice Dollars of \$250 for that event can be used next year. For VBS, another \$250 Choice Dollars will be obtained.

Chris Severt brought up VBS currently scheduled for June. After Council discussed the health situation we are dealing with, it was decided to cancel VBS for this summer. The materials purchased for this year's VBS will be used next year.

Pastor's Report:

Advised as we go forward during this time, we need to keep in mind Salem's Mission Statement . Pastor's summer schedule is up in the air due to the health crisis. Winkle was cancelled for March. Catechism has proceeded via Zoom. Updated Council on bible classes. Pastor did not see any shut-ins but has gone through the alphabet, calling Congregational members to make contact with them. Pastor reported Camp Luther is struggling and is in need of support. The Cupboard and Closet food side is currently open, continuing to provide food to children. Gave update on Salem's website/Facebook in that information can be obtained on the Coronavirus and sermons in written format. Working on improving technology for church services. Received \$807.00 in E-giving in March. Pastor received a phone call from David Garm who is part of a Music Ministry Family that is touring Missouri Synod Churches this year. In that conversation, Mr. Garm advised Pastor they could be in Barron on July 17, 2020. More discussion on what this would look like. Pastor reported Jen Millerman and Scott Quieser are looking at purchasing a new computer program as it is difficult to transfer data from the old computer to the new one. After Council discussed this issue, a motion was made by Tim Dennis, seconded by Maryann Thompson to allow monies to be spent not to exceed \$400 for the software accounting program and motion carried. A motion was made by Tim Dennis, seconded by Chris Severt to accept Pastor's Report and motion carried.

Stan Koenig advised he has been working to improve streaming services.

A motion was made by Chris Severt, seconded by Tom Lipke to adjourn and motion carried.

Closed with the Lord's Prayer.


