Pastor's Page

Dear Saints of God at Salem,

Have you ever heard this quote the following: "Every disappointment involves unmet expectations."? This quote could be used in every relationship that we have, especially in that of marriage. In pre-marriage counseling we talk about expectations and how they can realistic or unrealistic. I also let them know that their spouse will inevitably let them down—sometimes multiple times a day!

Marriage is not the only source of disappointment and unmet expectations. Every human relationship will deal with these issues. Have you been happy with *every* decision an elected official has made, even one for whom you voted? Does your boss ever let you down? Have your employees always done their job well? Do your friends always come through for you? Do your children always make good and wise decisions based on what you have taught them? Does your pastor let you down at times?

Human beings will disappoint by failing to meet expectations. No wonder the psalmist tells us in Psalm 146:3–4, "Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation. When his breath departs, he returns to the earth; on that very day his plans perish."

Parents have hopes and expectations for their children. Sometimes these are healthy expectations. Other times parents place unfair or unrealistic expectations on their children.

This upcoming Advent season, which begins at the end of November, during our midweek services, which begins on November 30, we will take a look at three different sons of men who were disappointments to their fathers.

In the first week, we will be introduced to Cain, the son of Adam. No doubt Adam had higher hopes for Cain than for him to be known as the first murderer in history. But his murder of his brother reveals the murder lurking in all of our hearts.

In the second week, we will be introduced to Ishmael, the son of Abraham. Though it was not his fault, Ishmael was a disappointment to Abraham because he was not the child of the promise. Abraham's efforts to take things into his own hands highlight our own tendency to do the same in our relationship with God.

In the third week, we will be introduced to Absalom, the son of David. This rebellious son broke David's heart and exposes the rebellion we display against our heavenly Father. But each week, we will also be pointed to a different Son, whom we will focus on entirely during the fourth week of Advent. This Son is the true Son of Adam. He is the true Son of David. He is the Son who never disappointed His Father. He is the Son who never did any wrong. He is the Son of whom the Father spoke: "This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him" (Matthew 17:5). This true Man, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, is also the Son of God, the very Son of God now living in our flesh and blood. This Son is Jesus, the Christ, the Messiah, who fulfills the hope of salvation "that we might receive adoption as sons" (Galatians 4:5). He is the One whom the psalmist spoke of in Psalm 146:5: "Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the LORD his God."

During this series, entitled *This Is My Son*, you will hear again that your heavenly Father is not disappointed in you. Rather, through Jesus, He considers you to be His beloved child, with whom He is well pleased.

As His children, He encourages you be amongst your family of faith here at Salem to worship together and to learn together about His Son, Your Savior Jesus. He also encourages you to be together in family discipleship in the homes.

I would encourage all of you to observe the season of Advent that begins at the end of this month of November as you follow along with our Advent Devotionals. You can also purchase an Advent Wreath for your homes and light the candles as we do each week in Church. If you have smaller children you could also purchase an Advent Wreath that they can help put together. Council Meeting 10/11/2022

Present: Pastor Michael Nielsen, Vice President Josh Millerman, Head Elder Paul Millerman, Secretary Sarah Duncan, Treasurer MaryAnn Thompson, President John Steele, Board of Education Chris Severt, Trustee Tom Lipke. Special guest: Matt Hoff from Hoff Financial.

Pastor led us in devotional and prayer.

Special guest presentation: Matt from Hoff Financial Services joined us to discuss the transition from Johnson/Agen to Hoff Financial throughout the month of October. He discussed their systems of accounting and bookkeeping and how they will benefit our church. He discussed reports and how they will help us get a clear picture of finances for Salem. He also talked about open communication.

Secretary Report: Secretary Sarah Duncan read the meeting minutes from 9/13/22. A motion was made by Paul Millerman to accept the minutes and seconded by Chris Severt and motion carried.

Treasurer Report: MaryAnn Thompson advised the September 2022 financial summary as follows: General fund balance as of 09/01/2022: \$62430.23 Income: \$9334.94 Expenses: \$14871.72 Net income: \$-5536.78. General Fund balance as of 09/31/2022: \$56893.45. Envelope Giving for July: General Fund Envelopes: \$8043.00 Missions: \$395.00 Building Fund: \$297.00 Gifts and memorials: \$0 Sunday School offering: \$39.71 Daycare income (envelopes) \$180.00 Air Conditioning: \$100 Vacation Bible School: \$0 Oil Well Schultz: \$255.73 Misc Income: \$0 Interest Income: \$13.24 Amazon Smile: \$11.26 Lutheran Hour: \$0 Cemetery Fund \$0 Thrivent Choice Dollars \$0 Current Bank Accounts: Salem Church Checking: \$24273.03 Savings: \$17326.99 Daycare Checking: \$30859.87 LCEF Account: \$29716.57. General fund envelope giving is still down from last year. MaryAnn will be giving a list of details to Hoff Financial of grant A&B for daycare. She will be getting budgets out to groups to discuss for the annual meeting. Discussion on cost of Google voice phone in daycare and decision to keep it. Gifts and memorials will be split back out of the general fund for a better look at the balance. A motion was made by Chris Severt to accept the report and seconded by Josh Millerman and motion carried.

Elder's Report: Paul Millerman advised that there are no transfers or releases. Elders discussed every Sunday communion. Discussion on budget. They will be doing pastor's review soon. A motion was made by Chris Severt to accept the report and seconded by Tom Lipke and motion carried.

Trustee's Report: Tom Lipke advised that the church and parsonage furnaces have been cleaned and serviced and are ready for winter. Discussion on fixing parsonage landscaping to prevent future issues with flooding in the basement. Tom got a quote of \$2200 to fix it. A motion was made by Josh Millerman to fix the landscaping if it could be done in the next 10 days and MaryAnn seconded the motion and motion was carried. There will be a church garage sale in the spring with a goal to raise the money to cover the expense of the landscaping at the parsonage. A motion was made by Paul Millerman to accept the report and seconded by Josh Millerman and motion carried.

Board Of Ed Report: Chris Severt advised that in the Sunday School, 3 balloons were found, 2 in Minnesota and 1 in Barron. Information regarding them is posted on the bulletin board going into the kitchen. The kids will be singing this coming Sunday and will be singing the last Sunday of every month. Sue is asking the board what organization they would recommend giving Sunday School offering to. Possibly Pregnancy Help Center, Camp Luther, or another local organization. We will decide at our next meeting. 21 children attended the first Sunday and 14 the second.

Library: Marilyn, once able after surgery recovery, will be working on the library. YFM: Trunk or Treat scheduled on Oct 29. Coordinating with the Chamber and Salem Childcare & Preschool. Pastor: Chamber will be donating turkey burger from The Turkey Store for the luncheon during Trunk or Treat. He would like to purchase This Is My Son booklet to give out at Christmas.

New Business: Melissa told us that the Childcare/Preschool is going to have a carnival during Trunk & Damp; Treat.

Childcare/Preschool: Discussion regarding staff evaluations. Emily made a motion to approve a 50 cent raise for Jasmine, Marlene seconded and the motion was approved. Staff files are almost complete. Waiting on Katelyn's HS diploma. Student files are not getting update. Reminders to parents aren't working. Suggested to corner the parents and set up a time to meet with them to get the required information. Collection letters will be looked at next meeting. Looked at and liked the letter Mary Ann wrote up for pay roll deduction. Discussed biting child issue. Several episodes of biting since the policy has been released. One more time child bites a letter will be given to the parents to have child un-enrolled. Update: Letter given to parent, on Thursday, un-enrolling child from childcare center due to biting. Plumbing issues have been

worked on and hopefully it is resolved. Tom Lipke made more lockers and installed them. The Center was approved for the August Grant program. \$2710 for Program A (Building) and \$1200 for Program B (Staff). At the next meeting we need to allocate Program A (Building)

funds. Melissa is addressing professional conduct during staff meetings. A motion was made by MaryAnn Thompson to accept the report and seconded by Josh Millerman and motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Nielsen advised that the tentative delivery date for the twins is November 12 and that is the last possible day. Thank you for the prayers during the week of the home stress. Winkel was at Immanuel Clayton. John Miels acting circuit visitor while Pastor Buechner recovers. Men's bible study: Ezekiel. Thursday bible study: Basics of biblical interpretation. Sunday bible study: Equipped. Catechism class is going well. Salem and the chamber are partnering for the Trunk or Treat event on Oct 29. A motion was made by Chris Severt to accept the report and seconded by Josh Millerman and motion carried.

Old Business:

Pastor is encouraging something going to CCLS as part of the mission budget – in addition to our district offering.

Church directory and pictorial will be out soon.

New Business:

Annual meeting date has been set to December 4 immediately following worship service. Brunch potluck.

A motion was made by MaryAnn Thompson and seconded by Chris Severt to adjourn the meeting and motion carried.
