
Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are over a year since the first Covid-19 virus was discovered in Wuhan China and over a year since it was discovered in the United States in the state of Washington. We've struggled through this Pandemic and the many restrictions placed upon us as well as the continued mandates and recommendations from federal, state, and local leaders as well as Public Health officials. Many of you have been away from the physical gathering of believers for close to a year. You've been worshipping with us online and even over the phone. I understand why. I have told many of you that there was a time earlier on that if I was not the pastor I would not have been back in the physical building. 2020 not only brought us Covid-19 but it was also an exceedingly difficult year in the political world, probably more so than any other election cycle.

We have struggled with 2020. We have been wanting 2021 to come and the year does not seem to be starting much better. There is still turmoil. There is a still a struggle. There is still this struggle since you and I are sinners. Let us make 2021 better and the way we can make 2021 better is by looking inside of ourselves, seeing ourselves as sinners and repent of our sin. When you receive God's grace, you receive his forgiveness!

Fellow redeemed, Ash Wednesday is February 17. This Lent we are going to be looking at the theme "Return to the Lord."

In the Book of Joel, the prophet paints a vivid picture of the coming judgment of God, the Day of the Lord. The imagery is bold and terrifying: hordes of locusts swarming over the land and decimating everything. Joel's prophecy has teeth even today as wars rage, natural disasters threaten and destroy, and our culture seems to be unraveling. But right in the middle of this frightening portent, we find a tender invitation from the Lord: "Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love;



and He relents over disaster" (Joel 2:13). God's invitation and promise finds its fullness in Jesus Christ, who personifies and accomplishes all that God declares. During this season of

Lent, we will consider the theme "Return to the Lord" and examine how the call to return played out in practical ways for the people who walked alongside Christ as He demonstrated and carried out God's grace and mercy on our behalf, taking God's wrath upon Himself, setting the stage for God to "turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind Him" (Joel 2:14).

Each sermon in this series focuses on a particular event in the Passion, with a special focus on the people involved in the event. Studying the events and people helps to connect the hearers with their own sinful nature, to emphasize how we have turned away from the Lord, and to reinforce and rejoice in God's call for us to return to Him with all our heart.

As we gather in whatever means possible, it is time to return to the Lord. It is time to repent. It is time to receive God's grace. As we focus on returning to the Lord, I will be offering a Sunday Bible Study via zoom and live at 10:30 AM. We will be looking at the themes from the preceding Wednesday.

I would also encourage you to come to the Lord's House and see me to receive the Lord's Supper if you are still uncomfortable coming amongst a group of people. This is important for you to receive. For through his Body and Blood you again receive God's grace, his forgiveness of sins.

It is time to Return to the Lord!

Council Meeting: 01/12/2021

Present: Trustee Tom Lipke, Treasurer Stan Koenig, Vice President Josh Millerman, Pastor Michael Nielsen, Secretary Sarah Duncan, Board of Ed MaryAnn Thompson, President John Steele.

President John Steele called the meeting to order. Pastor Nielsen led us in devotional and prayer.

Secretary Report: Secretary Sarah Duncan read the council meeting minutes from December 8, 2020. A motion was made by Josh Millerman and Stan Koenig to accept the minutes as read and motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Stan Koenig advised the December 2020 financial summary as follows: General Fund (4101) income for January to December as \$. General Fund (4101) for December is \$2581.53. Checking account at Sterling Bank is \$42997.01. Savings account at Sterling Bank is \$14203.15. The LCEF: \$22773.36. Missions \$542. Sunday School \$140. Building Fund \$242. Tom Lipke and Josh Millerman made a motion to accept the report and motion carried.

Elders Report: Josh Millerman is reading Head Elder Paul Millerman's minutes for the 01/04/2021 elder meeting. Bud Bremer's membership has been moved from Christ in Chetek. Loan papers are ready, pushing back until after March 1st. Discussion on plans for if Pastor Nielsen gets sick. Solid plans have been made by the elders so services, bible studies, and catechism can continue. Pastor would like to do an Elders study. He is looking at books to best suit the group. Pastor might be able to visit nursing home soon. Tuesday and Thursday morning bible studies going well. It was moved and approved to have an extra communion service at the noon service during Lent. Pastor would like to start 'Families of the week.' Discussion on how we can keep our church together during the pandemic and then get them back once its over. Elders want to know if there is anything they can do to help families that are sick and/or hungry. Elders will start putting numbers back up on the board for people watching on Facebook. Closed with The Lord's Prayer. Stan Koenig and Tom Lipke made a motion to accept the report and motion carried.

Trustee's Report: Tom Lipke advised that a bookshelf has been built for Cindy upstairs and a lock was also put on her closet. Rooms in back are 100% cleaned out and ready for construction. Parsonage is having draining issues. Bank deposit box is all set up. Stan Koenig and Josh Millerman made a motion to accept the report and motion carried.

Board of Education: MaryAnn Thompson advised that the Sunday school program went very well. Many thanks to Jolene and Sue for their hard work on it. Sue is sending SS packets to the children that are not attending. YFM tree burning is Jan 15 at 5:30 pm. Bring a dish to pass. BOE is discussing a timeline on hiring a daycare director. February/March there will be an ad put on INDEED. Josh Millerman met with the inspector in January. The daycare policy committee is working on updating the handbook and parent policy. Stan Koenig and Josh Millerman made a motion to accept the report and motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Nielsen advised that he is writing his project for his Doctor of Ministry. He attended Winkel via zoom on 01/12/2021. There is a chance district and synod convention might be pushed back each year. We need to schedule a brief voter meeting before February 15. Pastor will be attending a Doxology in Green Lake from January 27th to 29th. Bible studies going well and are studying the Christian difference and Scientology. Sunday morning bible studies on hold for now. Confirmation classes going well. They have done some 'hybrid' classes on Zoom when the students cannot attend. Shut ins are still being called on the telephone. Lent 2021 will be Return to the Lord. Daycare remodel will be starting shortly and building committee will be gathering soon. Barron Area Clergy Association have not been meeting. Pastor wants to thank for the quick response when it comes to issues with the parsonage. Tom Lipke and Josh Millerman made a motion to accept the report and motion carried.

New Business: Treasurer Stan Koenig will be working with Johnson/Agen to make sure things are getting put in the right categories for accounting purposes. Should we be setting up new accounts for day care/shelter? North WI district website states that there is a 2nd round of payroll protection available. Application needs to be received by March 31.

A motion was made by MaryAnn Thompson and seconded by Josh Millerman and motion carried to approved taking out \$35000 from the Klein Estate in the Trust Fund so we can be ready to start making payments for the day care construction.

The phone system needs to be removed. Working with Mosaic on this. CWS security is meeting with Pastor to discuss door access and security. Pastor purchased 3 months of Zoom. It would be nice to do a full Zoom membership so the meetings can go as long as needed and can have as many participants as possible to accommodate our church needs. The cost is \$149 per year. Stan Koenig made a motion to purchase 1 year of Zoom and MaryAnn Thompson seconded and the motion was carried. A motion was made by Josh Millerman and seconded by Tom Lipke and motion carried to schedule the voters meeting has been scheduled for January 31 to talk about special convention resolution immediately following the church service.

A motion was made by Stan Koenig and seconded by Josh Millerman to adjourn and motion carried.


