Secretary Report: Secretary Sarah Duncan read the meeting minutes from 5/9/23. A motion was made by Don Duncan to accept the minutes and seconded by Chris Severt and motion carried. Treasurer Report: MaryAnn Thompson advised the May 2023 financial summary as follows: General fund balance as of 4/30/2023: \$61770.80 Income: \$10984.43 Expenses: \$-14589.79 Net income: \$-3605.36. General Fund balance as of 5/30/2023: \$58165.44. Envelope Giving for February: General Fund Envelopes: \$9915 Missions: \$340 Building Fund: \$325 Gifts and memorials: \$206.16 Sunday School offering: \$0 YFM Sunday School Missions: \$10.55 Daycare income (envelopes) \$321 Air Conditioning: \$100 Vacation Bible School: \$0 Oil Well Schultz: \$98.50 Interest Income: \$46.45 Amazon Smile: \$0 Lutheran Hour: \$0 Cemetery Fund \$0 Thrivent Choice Dollars \$0 Current Bank Accounts: Salem Church Checking: \$39855.77 Savings: \$17335.07 Daycare Checking: \$45587.56 LCEF (Building Fund) Account: \$32798.54 Daycare Loan Balance: \$87195.64. Scott has gifts & memorials done and those will be printed in the August news-letter for the congregation. We need to use VBS gifts & memorials before we use budgeted amount. Workers compensation bill was a big expense this month. Church mutual sent a check for \$3000 due to an adjustment. A motion was made by Chris Severt to accept the report and seconded by Tom Lipke and motion carried.

Elder's Report: Don Duncan advised that there were no new transfers or releases. Discussed the elder's schedule. No word yet for the active shooter button. Looking at putting together an emergency plan. Paul made a motion to not close the church due to government mandates and the board of elders agreed. Pastor is going to give the elders a business card with his contact info on it. Discussed communion trays. A motion was made by Chris Severt to accept the report and seconded by Tom Lipke and motion carried. Trustee's Report: Tom Lipke advised that he got a quote for the altar guild roof. It will cost between \$5000-\$8000. We need to have a brief special voters meeting in order to approve the funds for the roof repair. This will be held on July 9 immediately following the service. Carpet cleaning day is July 6 at 9am and we still need some more carpet shampooers. Tom is getting quotes to fix the lower parking lot. Lawn mowing is going well and most of the weeks are filled with volunteers. Windows will be washed. Inside church cleaning will be sometime in late July. A motion was made by Don Duncan to accept the report and seconded by Chris Severt and motion carried.

**Board Of Ed Report:** Chris Severt advised that Melissa needs to do some further training in order to get approval for a food program. Daycare updated parent handbook. Hired 2 new employees. More bonuses given: Melissa \$400, Holly \$250, Janica \$250, Kaitlyn \$250, Denise \$250. Child care is purchasing Concordia preschool material. VBS was a huge success (thanks to Chris & Jolene for an excellent job done). A motion was made by MaryAnn Thompson to accept the report and seconded by Tom Lipke and motion carried.

**Pastor's Report:** We read together the mission: The Mission of Salem Lutheran Church is to be what God called us to be through faith in Jesus Christ, a body of believers engaged in building the Kingdom of God by discipling the Barron area with His Word and Sacrament ministry. Men's Bible Study Daniel. Thursday Bible study the book "Misquoted." Sunday Morning Bible Study is

studying various texts of the lectionary. CC Lutheran School: sign going up soon and meeting with 'School Choice' which will give the school government funding for students. Mission grants: think of things to apply for. Revitality – Strategic planning will start in September. Pastor getting a schedule together. Needs list: Lois Klug family request to purchase the office computer and the light for the organ. Arleigh Lutz 60th anniversary. A motion was made by Don Duncan to accept the report and seconded by Tom Lipke and motion carried.
