Dear Family of God at Salem,

Just think about what we, the family of God has accomplished this summer. We opened the summer sharing the God's Miraculous Mission with many children during Vacation Bible School. During the month of June, we also shared information on the potential daycare at Salem regarding Space. This meeting, I sensed excitement at this possibility. Council Meeting of August 13, 2019

President Paul Millerman called the meeting to order and Pastor Nielsen led us in prayer.

Present: President Paul Millerman, Vice-president Chris Severt, Pastor Nielsen, Treasurer Stan Koenig, Elder Tim Dennis, Trustee Tom Lipke and Secretary Kelly Cornelius

Absent: Maryann Thompson

Secretary's Report: Secretary Kelly Cornelius read the Council Meeting minutes of July 9, 2019. Tom Lipke made note that the amount due Anderson's for blacktop repair costs actually came to \$1,980 rather than \$3,873.00 as was noted in last month's report. A motion was made by Tim Dennis, seconded by Tom Lipke to accept the minutes as read and motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Stan Koenig reported the July Financial Summary as follows: General Fund balance as of July 1, 2019, at \$13,051.65 (in the hole). General Fund income of \$8,552.08 and General Fund expenses at \$11,384.88 for a balance as of the end of July of \$15,884.45 (in the hole). July Missions: \$568.00. Building Fund: \$336.00. Continuing to receive monies toward an air condition. Further, \$8,000 was transferred from the Savings account for the playground. The checking account at Sterling Bank is at \$34,707.67 and the savings account is at \$8,670.43. LCEF Building Fund: \$17,499.74. The General Fund (1401) balance for January to, 2019, is \$63,409.47. A motion was made by Chris Severt, seconded by Tim Dennis to accept the Treasurer's Report and motion carried.

Elder's Report: Pastor Nielsen's wife and children will now be covered by Christian Health Ministries for health insurance rather than Concordia's health insurance plan. It was moved and approved to reimburse Pastor Nielsen for the difference in cost savings between the two health plans from July 1, through the remainder of 2019. Pastor Nielsen's wife and children will be covered by Christian Health Ministries Health Insurance for 2020, while pastor remains on Concordia Health Insurance. It was moved and approved that Salem will give pastor the savings between Christian Health Ministries insurance and Concordia Health Insurance for his family in a manner to be determined. The savings is estimated to be about \$ 9,486 per year. Pastor's HSA will stay the same. It was felt the Schutz Estate oil monies should continue to go into the General Fund. The Elder's Budget will be completed at the September meeting. An Elder's Budget committee meeting will be August 14, 2019, at 6:30 p.m. Pastor's performance review will be at the September meeting. It is felt that we should plan on replacing a computer every two years, so each of our three computers would be replaced every six years. We went over the elders and ushers duties and the ushers schedule for 2020. In July, pastor had 15 shut-ins visits, three hospital visits, five home visits, one office visit, and there were two funerals. Average attendance for July was 73.

Trustee's Report: Tom Lipke reported the upper parking lot work was done by Anderson's in the amount of \$1,980. Storm damage work done at church and parsonage by Salem members. Got quote from Beranek Electric for repair of the outdoor broken cross due to the recent storm. Tom contacted Mutual Insurance regarding same. Gave an update on the playground in that the fence has been installed and the wood chips to follow for completion of the project. The gas line from 14th Street to the church has been replaced. Tom reported issues with the front entrance door again. Tom will do some checking with other glass companies for their quotes on repair costs. Tom hasn't yet gotten a bid from Dean Hanson as it relates to a quote to the altar guild windows.

Board of Ed: In Maryann Thompson's absence, Pastor advised Sunday School staff in place and stated we could use more substitute teachers. Leaders are Sue Millerman and Maryann Thompson. Have a new Sunday School Curriculum. Jolene will head up music this year as well as the Children's Christmas Program.

Pastor's Report: In addition to information given in the Elder's Report, Winkle is set for September 10th. Woody from Camp Luther will be here November 3rd. Pastor will be attending the annual conference in Minneapolis on November 14 - 16, 2019. New Worker's Conference set for August 27th. Pastor's Conference is in Marquette September 23 - 25. Talked about all Boards training here for Salem. Christmas theme will be "Behold the Child". Talked about the Thursday Bible Study possibly starting at noon. Will do some checking into. Catechism Class orientation is August 28, 2019, at 7:00 p.m. First day of class will be September 4th. Two more shut-ins added to the list. Advised about Lutheran Disaster Response Training

Old Business: Talked about security camera needs for Salem and feel that we would only need two cameras for now.

A motion was made by Chris Severt, seconded by Tim Dennis to adjourn and motion carried.

Closed with the Lord's Prayer.



State licensing rules for staffing

- Birth-2 years requires 1 adult for every 4 children
- 2-2 ½ years requires 1 adult for every 6 children
- 2 ½ -3 years requires 1 adult for every 8 children
- · 3-4 years requires 1 adult for every 10 children
- 4-5 years requires 1 adult for every 13 children
- 5-6 years requires 1 adult for every 17 children
- 6+ years requires 1 adult for every 18 children
